1. HOST, PLACE AND DATE OF COMPETITIONS

The host for the World Aquatics Championships 2025, Republic of Singapore and Singapore Aquatics, have established an Organising Committee, which will be in charge for the preparation and organisation of the competitions under the control and supervision of World Aquatics.

8. RULES

The Championships will be held under the [World Aquatics Competition Regulations](#) in force at the time of the Championships.

9. SUBSTITUTION, WITHDRAWAL AND APPEALS

9.1 Substitution

Any entered competitor may be substituted by another entered competitor at the Team Leaders' Meeting. It is mandatory for one representative of each Federation to take part in the Team Leaders' Meeting. Failing to do so will result in a fine of one-hundred (100) Swiss Francs.

9.2 Withdrawal

In all competitions except water polo, a competitor or team not wishing to take part in a semi-final or final in which qualification was earned shall withdraw within thirty (30) minutes following the preliminaries or the semifinals of the event in which the qualification took place. The Member Federation of any competitor who withdraws from the heats/preliminary rounds after the Team Leaders' Meeting or from a semi-final or final more than thirty (30) minutes after the preliminaries or semi-finals of the event in which qualification was earned, shall pay without excuse to World Aquatics the sum of one-hundred (100) Swiss francs; in case of a relay, duet or team, the sum shall be two-hundred (200) Swiss francs.

If a team withdraws from a World Aquatics Water Polo event any time after the draw has been concluded, and without the approval of the Management Committee, then that team will be sanctioned by the Bureau with an economic sanction of eight-thousand (8,000) Swiss Francs, from which six-thousand (6,000) Swiss Francs goes to the Organiser, and suspension from all competitions for a minimum period of three months up to a maximum period of two years.

If a competitor in the World Aquatics Open Water Swimming 3km Knockout Sprint event not wishing to take part in a semi-final or final in which qualification was earned shall withdraw within five (5) minutes following the preliminaries or semi-final of the event in which the qualification took place.

9.3 Appeals

Appeal Procedure

An appeal must be submitted on the official World Aquatics appeal form ("Appeal Form"), which can be found on the World Aquatics website and in venue.

The Appeal Form must be submitted in accordance with the following timelines:

- o **Swimming:** within thirty (30) minutes of the respective event's completion.
- o **Open Water Swimming:** within thirty (30) minutes of the respective race's completion.



- o **Diving and High Diving:** an oral complaint may be made by the Athlete, or on behalf of the Athlete by a team official, to a referee, immediately after the execution of a dive, a round of dives, or a section of the competition. If the complaint is not accepted by the referee, the formal appeal must be submitted on the Appeal Form within thirty (30) minutes of the session's completion.
- o **Artistic Swimming:** within thirty (30) minutes of the session's completion.

The appeal must be submitted to the designated World Aquatics representative ("World Aquatics Representative"), who shall be identified at the beginning of the applicable competition. The appeal shall only be considered complete if it is accompanied by a deposit of five hundred (500) United States dollars (or an equivalent amount in the applicable local currency).

The World Aquatics Representative will present the appeal to the Chair of the Jury of Appeal, who will review the appeal and determine its validity. The Chair shall determine the validity as soon as reasonably possible following the appeal's submission.

If the Chair deems the appeal to be invalid, pursuant to the criteria in section 14, the deposit shall be forfeited. If the appeal is deemed to be valid, the Chair shall initiate a review by the Jury of Appeal which shall render a final decision on the appeal as soon as reasonably practical. The Chair's decision regarding validity is final.

If the Jury rules in favour of the appealing party, the deposit shall be returned to the appealing party, and the ensuing course of action shall be decided on a case-by-case basis.

If the Jury rules against the appealing party, the deposit shall be forfeited.

Jury of Appeal:

The Jury of Appeal shall be comprised of three members. One of the three members shall be the designated Chair. The three members shall be assigned by the World Aquatics President or Executive Director.

Jury members shall be void of conflicts of interest in advance of their appointment. Jury members have an obligation to declare any possible conflicts of interest that may arise, for which the World Aquatics Executive Director shall determine whether a conflict exists.

The World Aquatics Bureau shall also designate a fourth individual who will act as a standby Jury of Appeal member in the event that a selected Jury member must recuse himself/herself due to a conflict of interest (including, but not limited to, having business relations with or the same nationality as an appealing party).

The Jury of Appeal may consult video footage, documents and witnesses when making its decision, and may additionally choose to consult any other potentially impacted party, in person or in writing.



Decisions of referees shall be afforded a significant degree of deference. The Jury of Appeal shall not substitute its view of the appealed matter for that of the referee unless the appellant presents clear evidence that the referee's decision was made arbitrarily, irrationally, or in abuse of the discretion afforded to the referee.

Each member shall have one vote and the majority vote shall prevail.

The decision of the Jury is final.

Any allegations of eligibility violations are not subject this Appeal Procedure and shall be handled by the Aquatics Integrity Unit.

There will be no Appeal Procedure for the sport of Water Polo.

10. SWIMWEAR AND ADVERTISING

All competitors of the Championships shall abide by the current [World Aquatics Competition Regulations](#) pertaining to swimwear and advertising (Part 1, 8. Advertising Identification) as well as the specific uniform and equipment guidelines ([Uniform & Equipment Guidelines](#))

10.1 Competitors Bibs

The Bibs must be worn fully visible during Competitors' introduction and award ceremonies.

A Competitor removing the Bib before being presented at the start of an event or before completion of the medal ceremony may be disqualified.

10.2 Swimming Only

All manufacturers sponsoring and/or supplying swimming caps to World Aquatics Members should produce the swimming caps for the respective Member in accordance the specifications set out below.

- One (1) manufacturer's logo of a maximum size of 20cm² (**when the cap is not being worn**) on the front.
- The World Aquatics Partner logo from **Yakult** shall be printed on the **right side** of the cap. Please use the logo artwork attached (.jpg and .eps formats).
- The World Aquatics Partner logo from **Yakult** shall be of **20cm²** (H22.5mm x W90mm) in size (when is not being worn). Please refer to the attached World Aquatics Generic Cap Rules. Whenever the swimming cap is white, the Yakult logo should measure exceptionally H15mm x W90.5mm.
- The World Aquatics Partner logo from **Yakult** shall be printed in **red** (Pantone:199C) on a **white background (box)**
- One (1) flag and country name (code) of the size of 32cm² may be printed on the **left side** of the cap when worn.
- The athlete's name of the size of 20cm² may also be printed on the **left side** of the cap.



10.3 Open Water Swimming Caps

- In all Open Water events it is mandatory for the cap to display on each side the "national three-letter code" and may display the swimmer's national flag or the swimmer's name. The country code shall be a minimum of 8cm in height. Caps meeting the specifications of I.8.5 are not acceptable except for one (1) manufacturer's logo of a maximum size of 20cm² on the front
- Athlete's name of a maximum size of 20cm²: The competitor's name shall be printed under the country name (three letter code). Displaying the competitor's name is not compulsory.

11. ANTI-DOPING

Urine and blood samples will be collected during the World Aquatics Championships for the purpose of doping controls. The doping controls will be done in accordance with the World Aquatics Doping Control Rules and the World Anti-Doping International Standards which can be consulted [here](#). The operations will be supervised and coordinated by the International Testing Agency (ITA).

The list of prohibited substances can be consulted [here](#). As a reminder, all athletes are strictly responsible for any prohibited substance found in their sample and it is particularly important for them to check any medication they take against the prohibited list.

11.1 Mandatory Anti-Doping education course prior to participation

As per the World Aquatics Doping Control Rules, any athlete participating in the World Aquatics Championships must, prior to participation, have successfully completed the [eLearning Anti-Doping Education course "International-Level Athletes Education Program"](#) or an eLearning course developed and approved by their respective National Anti-Doping Organization that covers the same topics. Any athlete who has not met this requirement will not be eligible to compete and thus will not have their accreditation activated.

Please follow these instructions in order to complete the course:

- Step 1:

Access the eLearning course webpage [here](#).

- Step 2:

Click on "Register here" and follow the steps to register an account.

- Step 3:

Sign in to the new account just created.

- Step 4:



Select the course **“International-Level Athletes Education Program”** and complete the course to obtain at least 80% at the final exam at the end of the course. You can do the course again if you do not achieve 80% the first time. The course is available in 9 different languages.

○ Step 5:

Once the course has been successfully completed, download the certificate of completion, and send it to your World Aquatics Member.

○ Step 6:

The World Aquatics Member must upload the certificate of completion of each athlete on their respective GMS profile [here](#) (in the Sport tab).

Note: In order to avoid any issues, Members should not wait until their teams are finalised to inform their athletes about this requirement. Rather, they should ask all athletes who could potentially participate in the event to complete the course immediately.

Athletes who have already completed the course for previous World Aquatics events and who have uploaded their certificates of completion to their GMS profile do not need to follow the course again.

11.2 World Records and World Junior Records

As per the World Aquatics Doping Control Rules, any Athlete equalling or breaking a World Record or World Junior Record in Swimming, shall be tested immediately after the race, or at the latest, 24 hours after the race. If not selected for doping control after the race, it is the sole responsibility of the athlete(s) to come to the doping control station to request a test.

11.3 Continental or National Record



Should an Athlete equal or break a continental or a national record, it is the sole responsibility of the athlete(s) to check whether the rules of their Continental Organization(s) or Member(s) require a negative doping control in order to recognise the record. If this is required, the athlete must go to the doping control station to request a doping control test. This test will have to be paid by the athlete or their Member.

12. CONTROL OF EVENTS

12.1 Management Committee

The Management Committee shall be the members of the Bureau, who shall act as the Jury of Appeal.

12.2 World Aquatics Representatives

D. TEAM INFORMATION

14. REGISTRATION PROCEDURE AND SPORT ENTRIES

There will be three (3) successive entry steps to provide information to World Aquatics and the Organising Committee (OC) in order to register for the World Aquatics Championships. All the communication between the OC and Members will be confirmed by email. All Registrations and Entries shall take place through the World Aquatics General Management System (GMS) which can be accessed by [LINK - GMS](#).

Please note that the registration for the World Aquatics Championships Singapore 2025 is to be opened on 19 February 2025. The confirmed date will be communicated to all Member Federations as soon as possible.

THE ENTRY STEPS ARE AS FOLLOWS:

i. PRELIMINARY ENTRIES

TO BE SUBMITTED THROUGH THE GMS BY 11th March 2025, 23.59 GMT.

The Preliminary Entry is for the purpose of confirming the participation of the World Aquatics Member and indicating to the OC the maximum number of competitors, representatives, coaches, official delegates, etc., which each Member intends to register in each discipline.

ii. FINAL NOMINATIONS (ENTRIES BY NAME)

TO BE SUBMITTED THROUGH THE AQUA GMS BY 17th June 2025, 23.59 GMT.

The Final Nominations is the final deadline to register all Athletes, Team Officials and Member Representatives, that includes all relevant data for the purposes of Accreditation (including the mandatory Declaration Form and Anti-Doping Certificate), Visa free entry, possible travel details and accommodation.

All nominations must be submitted with the requested information duly and correctly completed in the World Aquatics GMS. By this date, the Member must also have completed the final room requests (exact number of rooms, dates, etc.) and provide the OC with the complete rooming list in the World Aquatics GMS.

AFTER THIS DEADLINE IT WILL NOT BE POSSIBLE TO REGISTER ANY MORE INDIVIDUALS TO THE EVENT. THE NUMBER OF REGISTRATIONS MUST NOT EXCEED THE NUMBERS SUBMITTED IN THE PRELIMINARY ENTRY.

The only exception allowed until the sport entries deadline is:

- Replacement in case of injury or illness, a person can be cancelled and another added, based on medical certificate.

Note: It is possible for the Members to register long lists, but these long lists should be reasonable and not exceed the numbers below, based on the preliminary entries.

iii. FINAL SPORT ENTRIES

TO BE SUBMITTED THROUGH THE AQUA GMS BY 27th June 2025, 23.59 GMT for Artistic Swimming, Diving, High Diving and Open Water Swimming.

In the case of Swimming and Water Polo, Final Sport entry deadline is 3rd July 2025, 23:59 GMT.

All Athletes must be registered and submitted for the event(s) they will be participating in. Specific information depending on the discipline will be requested to complete the sport entries. No late entries will be accepted. By this date, the Member must also have completed the travel details section.

Athletes who have no sport entries completed on this date will be removed from the GMS for this competition.



15. QUALIFICATION AND ENTRIES OF COMPETITORS

15.1 Swimming

Entry times will only be accepted if they have been achieved at a World Aquatics-approved qualification event within the period **9 March 2024 – 29 June 2025**. All times achieved outside this qualifying period will not be accepted.

15.2 Open Water Swimming

a) Entries

For the Olympic Games and the World Championships each World Aquatics Member may enter a maximum of two (2) males and two (2) females per individual event. For team events in the World Championships, the Member can enter only one (1) team per event comprised of two (2) male and two (2) female Competitors. Athletes may only swim in one team event. Withdrawals can be made up to and including at the Teams Technical Meeting. Any entered competitor may be substituted by another entered competitor at the Team Leaders' Meeting

b) Team Relay Event

Team Relay event consists of 4 swimmers, 2 male & 2 female • Relay-only swimmers can be entered into the OW team relay events of the Championships.

c) Qualifying Time Standards

For safety reasons, only swimmers who have accomplished and can demonstrate the following standard times at any of the following distances will be allowed to register for the World Aquatics Championships – Singapore 2025.

15.3 Diving

- Each NF may enter a maximum of two (2) competitors per event, regardless of standards, for each individual event, one (1) team of two (2) competitors for each synchronised and mixed synchronised event and one (1) team with a maximum of four (4) competitors for the mixed team event.
- Each diver, or diver's representative, shall deliver to the Referee, or his designated representative, a complete statement of the selected dives on the official form of the event for the preliminary competition and all the following sessions of the competition.



15.4 High Diving

The World Aquatics Championships – Singapore 2025 is open to all athletes who were approved via the General Management System (GMS) to participate in the World Aquatics High Diving World Cup – Bahrain 2024 and/or the World Aquatics High Diving World Cup – Brasilia 2024, prior to its cancellation.

Eligibility Criteria

- **Approved Athletes:** Athletes who were formally approved on the GMS to compete in either or both aforementioned World Cup events will be eligible for qualification.
- **Maximum Athlete Representation:** Each Federation may enter a maximum of three (3) athletes per gender.

Additionally, World Aquatics reserves the right to extend wild card invitations to athletes. Any decisions regarding wild cards will be made and communicated in due course.

15.5 Artistic Swimming

- a) In World Championships each country shall be entitled to enter one Women Solo Technical, one Women Solo Free, one Male Solo Technical, one Male Solo Free, one Women Duet Technical, one Women Duet Free, one Mixed Duet Technical, one Mixed Duet Free, one Open Team Technical, one Open Team Free and one Open Acrobatic Routine.
- b) No changes to the entries will be accepted after the GMS sport entries deadline unless on medical grounds. A medical report must be sent to the World Aquatics Office and will be reviewed for approval by the World Aquatics Sports Medicine Committee. A 500 USD fine will be applied for any non-medical changes after the deadline.
- c) Team routines shall consist of four (4) to eight (8) competitors and a maximum of two (2) reserves. The total number of competitors may include a maximum of two (2) male competitors.
- d) The entry shall designate the name of the Women Solo Technical and the reserve, the name of the Women Solo Free and the reserve, the name of the Male Technical Solo and the reserve, the name of the Male Solo Free and the reserve the names of the Women Duet Technical competitors and maximum one reserve, the names of the Women Duet Free competitors and maximum one reserve, the names of the Mixed Duet Technical competitors (and maximum two reserves), the names of the Mixed Duet Free competitors (and maximum two reserves) the names of the Open Team Technical competitors and maximum of two reserves, the names of the Open Team Free competitors and maximum of two reserves, and the names of the competitors in the Acrobatic Routine and maximum of two reserves.



- e) Any changes of the names of the competitors from the most recent entry lists must be handed to the referee in writing at least two hours prior to the published start time of routine number one. This time must be published in the official competition schedule. Changes after this can only be made in case of sudden illness or accident of a competitor and if the reserve is ready to compete without delaying the competition. The final decision in such a situation shall be made by the referee. For preliminary solo competitions, the solo reserve may be substituted if registered in the GMS. For subsequent events, no substitution will be allowed.
- f) If the lack of the reserve reduces the Team size to less than that defined in the [World Aquatics Competition Regulations](#) the team shall be disqualified.
- g) Failure to notify the Referee of substitution and/or scratching according to the Competition Regulations shall result in disqualification of the routine.

15.6 Water Polo

a) Women's and Men's Tournaments

– The competition shall be between a maximum of sixteen (16) teams elected in the following manner:

i) The three (3) highest ranking teams from the Olympic Games Paris 2024, three (3) highest ranking teams from the World Cup 2025, one (1) team from the host country and nine (9) teams from the five (5) continents to be selected through continental qualification tournaments or continental championships. The nine (9) teams from the continents shall be selected according to the following formula: Europe – 3; Americas – 2; Asia – 2; Africa – 1; and Oceania – 1.

ii) If any one of the teams already qualified from the Olympic Games Paris 2024 and also in the first three (3) at the World Cup 2025 the next ranked team from the World Cup 2025 qualifies.

iii) The highest qualifying team(s) from the continental qualification tournament or continental championships shall be entitled to represent that continent; if any team does not accept, then the next highest ranked team willing to accept and participate in the World Championships shall qualify.

iv) If the host country is already included in the three (3) highest ranking teams from the Olympic Games Paris 2024, then that entry position shall be filled by the next highest placed team from the Olympic Games Paris 2024.

v) If another of the three (3) highest ranking teams from the Olympic Games Paris 2025 or one (1) of the three (3) highest ranking teams from the World Cup 2025 does not enter, then that position shall be filled from the next highest placed team from the World Cup 2025.

vi) If a team has already qualified from the Olympic Games Paris 2024 and/or from the World Cup 2025, plus this team is also in a qualified position at the Continental Qualification Event, then the next highest placed team from that Continental Qualification Event shall qualify to the World Championship.



vii) If no team enters from a continent or if there is an unfilled vacancy from among the teams qualifying from the Olympic Games Paris 2024 or the World Cup 2025, then each vacancy for that World Championship shall be filled by the next highest placed team(s) from the World Ranking.

- The Women's and Men's competitions shall be conducted in accordance with [World Aquatics Competition Regulations](#).

- Before each game, each squad can be varied compared to the team list of the previous games. The Coach can choose only from the previously registered two reserved players. The detailed timeline will be shared with the team leaders at a later stage.

- Each game must have a winner. If a game ends with a tie, the teams must go into a penalty shoot-out according to the rules. The matches shall be scored as follows:

- (A) win in the regular time = 3 points
- (B) win after the penalty shoot-out = 2 point
- (C) loss after the penalty shoot-out = 1 point
- (D) loss in the regular time = 0 points



16. ATHLETE ELIGIBILITY AND QUOTA

16.1 Eligibility

A competitor must be a citizen by birth or naturalisation of the nation he/she represents.

Passport from the nation that the athlete represents will be requested for the registration procedure. Additional documents will also be requested in specific cases according to the [World Aquatics Competition Regulations](#).

Any competitor changing his affiliation from one national governing body to another must comply with the World Aquatics Competition Regulations and contact World Aquatics to complete the procedure.

18. ACCREDITATION

The quotas of team officials (coaches, team leader, medical staff, support staff, etc.) allowed by discipline are defined in [Section D. Team Officials](#). Participating World Aquatics Members must comply with the quotas, as in principle, World Aquatics will not allow any extra officials. Any exceptional requests for additional officials will be considered and reviewed by World Aquatics for approval. In this case, a fee of one hundred-fifty (150) USD will be charged for each additional accreditation duly approved.

Individuals registered under the “Team Official” category can only select one discipline. The discipline that is selected will then include this person inside the Team Official quota for that particular discipline. For individuals involved in more than one discipline, please select the discipline that they will be most associated with during the Championships.

Only persons aged of 18 or older as of the first day of the World Aquatics World Championships are allowed to be accredited as Team official.

Concerning World Aquatics Member Representatives, the President and the General Secretary, officially recognized by World Aquatics, will be entitled to free accreditation (This cannot be transferred to any other person).

Any other individual registered under the World Aquatics Member Representative category will be charged a fee of one hundred-fifty (150) USD for their accreditation. World Aquatics Member Representatives are NOT included in Team Official quotas and are restricted according to the quotas below.

VENUE ACCESS:

Athletes will have access to all training venues and the competition venues where they are competing. For all other competition venues, Athletes will be granted access to the Team seating area only.

Team Officials and World Aquatics Member Representatives will have access to all competition and training venues.

Important note: Each person must be registered under the function and role she/he will be fulfilling during the World Aquatics World Championships. If an individual will perform multiple functions (e.g. Coach in Swimming and Team Leader in Open Water Swimming), please select the most senior position as only one function can be selected during registration.

(e.g. 2: If a Member representative Board Member is also the coach of the team, this person should be registered as a "Team Official" and "Coach" in order to have the correct access to fulfill her/his duties at the event.)

The World Aquatics Member is entirely responsible for registering the participants with their correct functions and roles, so that the correct accreditations will be issued. No accreditations will be changed or re-printed during the event.

LOSS OF ACCREDITATION BADGE:

If your accreditation badge is lost, it must be reported immediately to the nearest security personnel from the Organising Committee. A penalty fee may be charged for the reproduction of lost accreditation badges.

Official port of entry: Changi International Airport (SIN) Terminal 1, 2, 3 and 4

The Singapore 2025 Organising Committee (OC) will provide ground airport transfers from/to Changi International Airport (SIN) for all participants registered for the World Aquatics Championships and are residing at official hotels, based on the latest flight details updated in the GMS.

Failure to do so may result in no transportation being arranged by the OC and may be the responsibility of the World Aquatics Member.

During the Championships, shuttle bus service will be provided from all official hotels to/from the venue, based on a pre-determined schedule. Further details regarding this matter will be provided in the Singapore 2025 Transportation Guide.

If participants are not staying in any of the official hotels or do not require ground airport transfer, participants may indicate in the GMS **"I have made my own travel arrangements."**

Arrival Procedures

- Singapore 2025 Organising Committee will be providing airport transfers from Changi Airport to official hotels for arriving participants. Please ensure that arrival flight Information is updated correctly in the GMS.
- For this reason, we strongly recommend to confirm that your flight information has been updated to GMS.
- Singapore 2025 staff and volunteers will be deployed for Meet and Greet carrying the Official Singapore 2025 Welcome Sign. They will guide you and your team to the respective ground transport.
- If you have missed the arranged transport, please approach the transport office/desk/helpline for further assistance.
- Transport will arrive at Changi Airport **+15 mins** after the scheduled flight arrival times. If participants require more time to clear immigration or there is last minute change in flight details (which are not updated in GMS), please contact the Singapore 2025 transport team.
